Dear Mr. Foley,

As you are aware on the 28 May 2019 the Minister for State at the Department of Business, Enterprise and Innovation, Mr. Pat Breen TD, made a Sectoral Employment Order (SI No. 234 of 2017) setting certain legally enforceable minimum conditions of employment for workers in the construction sector.

Section 14 (3) of the Industrial Relations Amendment Act 2015 provides the Labour Court cannot consider a request for an investigation until at least twelve months after the date of a previous Sectoral Employment Order.

Given the expiry of the required twelve months, The Congress Construction Industry Committee comprising of BATU, CONNECT TRADE UNION, OPASTI, SIPTU and UNITE THE UNION are requesting the Labour Court to conduct a further investigation of the terms and conditions of employment of workers in the construction sector. In particular, we are requesting the Labour Court to investigate:

- the minimum rates of remuneration including basic pay and travelling time;
- the standard daily and weekly hours of work; and
- pension contributions.

I have attached the required application form, a statutory declaration and a copy of a report compiled by the Nevin Economic Research Institute detailing the numbers employed in the sector. If you require any additional information do not hesitate to contact the undersigned.

The NERI was asked by the ICTU Construction Industry Committee to provide an estimate of the number of employees in the construction sector who fall within the definition of the sector as set out in the Sectoral Employment Order (SI No. 234 of 2017).

Estimating sector size

The CSO's Labour Force Survey (LFS) is a detailed quarterly release from which most up to date labour market statistics are drawn. Among other indicators, the LFS breaks employment down by occupational group according to the Standard Occupation Classification 2010 (SOCCODE 2010).

The CSO published a report along with a detailed breakdown of estimates of employment in occupations, the structure of Irish occupations as well as estimates of occupations within sectors using data collected in the first quarter of 2019 back to 2013.¹

The CSO estimate for *Skilled Construction and Building Trades* (SOCCODE 53) in all sectors economy in Q1 2019 was 78,600.

This group is made up of three sub-groups that are in turn made up of various skilled construction workers for which the CSO also provide estimates:

1) Construction and Building Trades (531), (Steel erectors, Bricklayers and masons, Roofers, roof tilers and slaters, Plumbers and heating and ventilating engineers, Carpenters and joiners, Glaziers,

window fabricators and fitters)². Approximately 55,500 workers are estimated in these occupations.

- 2) Building Finishing Trades (532) (floorers, wall tilers, Painters and decorators). Approximately 19,700 workers.
- 3) Construction and building trades supervisors (533). Approximately 4,000 workers (latest figure for 2017).

The same report shows that 64.7 percent of workers in *Skilled Trades* are employees giving us an <u>estimate of 50,900 in *Skilled Construction and Building Trades*.</u>

The report also provides estimates on *Skilled Trades* (this wider category includes metal and electrical workers) in the *Construction* sector alone. Out of 144,600 in employment in *Construction* in the first quarter of 2019, 83,900 were in *Skilled Trades*.

Considering employees make up 64.7 percent of employment *Skilled Trades*, the rest being self-employed, the estimate is 54,300 *Skilled Trades* employees in *Construction*.
